Georgia Tech's Safety and Health Consultation Program is a free and confidential service funded by the U.S. Department of Labor and available to small businesses in the state of Georgia.

About Our Consultation Program

The OSHA 21(d) Consultation Program at Georgia Tech provides free, confidential, on-site consultation services for small companies (fewer than 250 employees per location and no more than 500 employees corporate-wide) in Georgia that need assistance in occupational safety and health. Employers have the option to choose from several different types of assistance, including evaluations of a facility's physical safety and health hazards, required technical and employee training programs, and its safety and health management system.

The OSHA 21(d) Consultation Program assists companies in the following areas:

- Electrical Safety
- Powered Industrial Trucks
- Respiratory Protection
- Air Sampling and Analysis
- Exposure to Chemicals
- Noise Measurements

- Recordkeeping

After a consultation visit, companies are provided with a confidential written report. The report includes the serious, other-than-serious, and regulatory hazards that were identified during the visit, references to applicable safety and health standards, and suggestions and practical solutions for correcting hazards and improving the company's



safety and health program. ***Any serious hazards identified during the consultation visit must be corrected by the company.***
